Dear Parent Caregivers

Earlier this year I let you know that my son had had some problems with another child and that I had had to contact the school to intervene. That problem seems to be sorted thanks to ongoing support from school and wide separation in the boarding house! Although, as with all children, there always seems to be something.

The reason we sent our youngest son to boarding school is that he has significant working memory difficulties and dyslexia. He has always been a very anxious boy but of course coping in a school situation with a learning difficulty, as so many of you know, makes children behave differently. My husband and I knew that under all circumstances he had to make his own way in the world and we could not wrap him in cotton wool forever (I had visions of him sitting at home on his X-Box waiting for me to make him a sandwich, when he was 40!)

He needed to learn to stand on his own two feet without mum always running to his aide. This year he is in Year 8 and he has been getting on the phone doing what he does; crying and saying, "Mum, I can't do this." "Mum its too hard." "Mum this teacher hates me and doesn't help me." And the one that really breaks my heart "Mum, I am dumb, Its all too hard."...... Of course he has been doing the same thing to his father and when you are 600 km away it tears your heart out. So I did what all mothers do. I became the "momma bear" and got on my high horse and worked myself up saying things to my husband like, "What is happening?" and "Don't they know what he needs to effectively learn?" and, "We are paying \$ &@)(for that school you would think they could get it right!"

So, I made an appointment with the school councillor and Year 8 coordinator to discuss what was happening.... NINE staff members turned up to that meeting from across that school. I was amazed. We are an Independent Public School but there is no way that we have the same resources as an Independent Private School! I know the staff at South Kalgoorlie have the same commitment and passion but unfortunately we just don't have those resources. We did address some issues but I could not fault their commitment to my son. While no school is perfect what more can you ask of any school.

Of course part of any problem is lack of communication and another BIG part was child manipulation. My son is being pushed to be more independent and he doesn't like it. Of course we should have known that because he does the same thing when he has to do the dishes. Parenting is not easy! I do thank goodness for one thing though. Thank goodness my ranting was within the walls of my own house and I was not silly enough to put it on Facebook or write it in an email. That is a lesson for ALL parents!

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

In order to enrich the opportunities available to your child in school. The Department of Education under section 99 of the School Education Act 1999, permits schools to request that all parents/caregivers pay a voluntary contribution. The amount requested is determined in consultation with the School Board. Contributions for 2016 are set at a flat rate of \$50 per student from Kindergarten to Year 6.

These funds are important if a school is to be able to budget effectively. Parents are requested to pay the contribution during the first two weeks of school. Other fees will be called for during the year for specific activities. A summary of proposed costs is produced annually and distributed to parents.

Payment can be made by either cash or cheque as the school does not have Eftpos or Credit card facilities.
