# Welcome Back Greetings from Room 19

Learning about light was very illuminating!

Light is a beam of energy that moves in a wave. The human eye needs light to see. Light moves very fast and in a straight line until something bends it. Mirrors and lenses are used in a periscope to bend light rays. Periscopes were used by soldiers during World War One. They allowed the soldiers in the trenches to see what was happening above at ground level without being shot at. The class made simple periscopes that worked really well and allowed us to see around corners.

Actually, the light reflection is bounced off the mirrors, still moving in a straight line.

Augustine – Jean Fresnel, a French inventor, developed a lens to be used in lighthouses. He used a series of prisms to bend the light rays. The thin "bee hive" or dome shape of the lenses allowed the beam of light coming from the lighthouse to be seen over greater distances. Building our own lighthouses was challenging. We were required to create an electrical circuit to light the bulb at the top of the structure.

Fraction can be very frustrating and tricky to learn. However, with great determination and perseverance, most of us are now more confident about that terrific trio of Dom, Nance and Vinnie! Knowing the times table is the key to taking the fuzz out

of fractions.

#### Dear Parents/Caregivers

During Term 3 our attendance dropped considerably due to so many families falling ill with the nasty viruses that were encroaching through the cold winter. It is wonderful to greet warmer weather and hopefully see improved attendance across the school. I would like to remind you again that if your child's attendance drops below 90% he or she is considered to be at educational risk because of the information being missed in the classroom. Often parents think that the important years of schooling are the later years of primary and high school. Many studies have found that if your child does not do well in Kindergarten and Pre-primary then they are likely to be behind for the rest of their school years. It is vital that your child gets into good attendance and school patterns as early as possible.

This year I have had a number of meetings with parents who have felt frustrated and annoyed over a incidents that have ended up being a lack of communication between school and home. Many things happen in a school day and we in admin often forget things and get things wrong. For which I am very sorry. Often these errors can be rectified by a phone call or a visit to the school, or, as we are doing now, by completing our parent survey.
