It was time to bow 1,2,3...and bend.

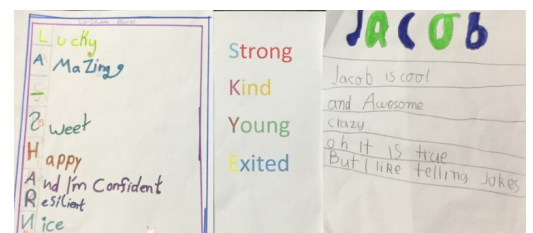
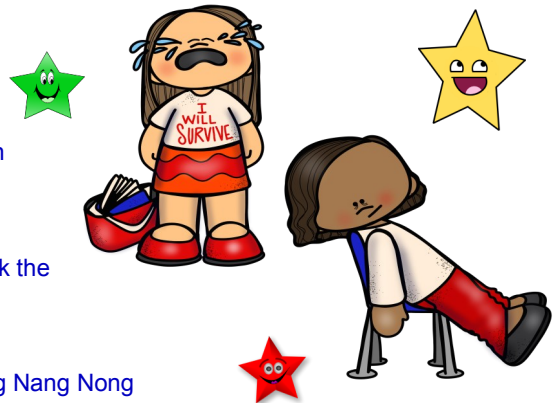
After the show our parents came back

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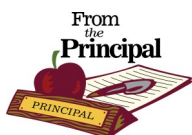
Dear Parents/Caregivers

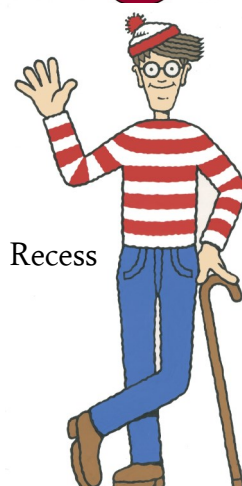

Earth Assist Rooms 19 &



There was great excitement as Rooms 19 and 20 were introduced to presenters from the Earth Assist Team. Although the group was large, the activity on animal and plant adaptations proved to be very informative and entertaining. The focus of the activity was on the adaptations made by plants and animals that live in semi – arid areas like Kalgoorlie-Boulder. The students were asked to draw a human showing the adaptations that would be necessary for it to survive in such a harsh environment. Some of the “creatures” that were created were very interesting indeed!

The group then moved out into the Eco Garden to plant some Bush-tucker plants and seeds. Steve demonstrated an adaptation made by the Karkula (silky pear). Each seed has a sail to help it fly even in gentle breezes. This ensures that the seeds are dispersed far and wide and will not have to compete for nutrients to survive.

Some lucky students received a special treat by tasting the yummy nuts from the congdon tree.

Numerous silky pear and congdon seeds are now tucked away slowly germinating. These will be added to the Eco Garden when they have become strong, young plants. Future students of SKPS will enjoy a feast of delicious bush tucker.
